In August, a small group of board members interviewed over 30 candidates to select PHP's first employee, who is in training to become PHP's executive director. The team narrowed the list down to five candidates from which the executive board selected their

top candidate, Evan Sommerfeld. Once selected, Evan went to CareerSource as a candidate for their On-the-Job-Training program, a program that is partially funded with government monies. Evan was selected by both CareerSource and PHP to begin in early September.

Evan has a degree from Virginia Tech where he received training in business and leadership development. For over 9 years, he worked as an executive with the Boy Scouts of America managing facilities, staff, volunteers, customer service, marketing, budgeting, and events. Revenue increased significantly under his leadership.
